WHY A POPPY BRACELET?

POPPY - IN FLANDERS FIELDS MUSEUM

The flower contains a computer chip. Hold the flower up to the Wi-Fi symbol to open the access gates and to activate the computer screens in the museum.

Do you log in at the top of the stairs or don't you? (No. 1) You do not need to log in to visit the museum. By entering

the required information on the screen the following additional information will be displayed:



2. If possible, one of your 4 stories will be of someone from your province.

Read 4 stories of people who lived during the war

Four different stories of people who lived here during the war are linked to each bracelet. You can read them at 4 different booths by holding your bracelet up to the Wi-Fi symbol. You will recognize the booths by their viewing slots that are reminiscent of the former stereoscopic viewer. (No. 8, 13, 24, 31)

Activating the information screens

Throughout the museum you will see familiar and unfamiliar objects. Hold your bracelet up to the Wi-Fi symbol next to the screens to retrieve information via the touch screen (No. 11, 15, 16, 19, 22, 26)

Take your 4 personal stories home! (No. 37)

Send your 4 personal stories free of charge to your email address or your smartphone via the log-out kiosks at the end of the museum on the right. Hold your bracelet against the Wi-Fi symbol, wait, and then you can choose between email or smartphone.

How many persons with your surname died in Belgium during the First World War? (No. 34)


At the end of the museum on your left near the commemoration section you can read how many persons with your surname died in Belgium during the First World War. Hold your bracelet up to the Wi-Fi symbol. This will only be successful if you entered your surname when you logged in at the beginning of the museum.

The bracelet gives you access to the museum, allows you to read everything in your own language, find more information and children can explore the museum in a fun way. For the children's route you need to log in at the reception desk.
